# **Social Distancing**

- Class schedules and classrooms have been adjusted to provide social distancing to the maximum extent possible.
- Student desks will be arranged to maximize space and sneeze guards are being installed.
- Visual cues are being added as reminders to practice social distancing and to implement safe traffic flow.

### Water Fountains/Water Bottles

- Water fountains are being converted to bottle filling stations.
- Students in grades 1st 8th must bring a water bottle to school. Parents will provide water bottles that must have a flip top with straw to prevent spills in the classroom. Student names should be placed on the water bottles.
- Students may not share water bottles.
- Students in PreK K will be provided bottled water utilizing disposable paper cups.

## Cleaning/Disinfecting

 In addition to daily cleaning and disinfecting of all classrooms, offices, restrooms and play areas using CDC approved cleaning products; all classrooms, offices and play areas will have spray bottles of sanitizing solution to use throughout the day. Restrooms, gym, library, cafeteria and other areas used by multiple groups of students will be sanitized in between groups.

#### Arrival/Dismissal Procedures

# **Morning Arrival**

- Students arriving on campus by car must have their mask on before exiting the vehicle and it must remain on until they enter their classroom. Wellness check stations will be utilized by duty teachers to check student's temperatures and look for visible symptoms of respiratory illness. If a student has a fever or showing visible signs of illness then the child will be placed back in the car. Temperatures will be recorded for those who are asked to leave campus and parents will be notified as to date for a safe return.
- Students in PreK 4th grade will report to the gym and use hand sanitizer before
  entering. Students will sit in cohort groups practicing social distancing until their
  teacher arrives then they will move to the classroom. Temporary/removable room
  dividers will be added to the gym to accommodate social distancing to the maximum
  extent possible.
- Morning assembly will be conducted in the classrooms.

	<ul> <li>Students in grades 5th - 8th will enter the junior high building, use hand sanitizer and report to their homeroom classroom.</li> <li>Duty teachers will monitor the hand sanitizer stations.</li> <li>Parents may not visit the office or other areas of campus during morning arrival until further notice. Cafeteria	<ul> <li>Food &amp; Nutrition with the Diocese of Lafayette are providing directives for the lunch program.</li> <li>Disposable containers and sporks will be used.</li> <li>Some classes will eat in their classrooms to accommodate social distancing guidelines. The cafeteria has been divided with partitions to accommodate social distancing for classes to remain in cohort groups for those eating in the cafeteria.</li> <li>Cafeteria will be sanitized between cohort groups utilizing the facility.</li> <li>Employees will be evaluated daily for symptoms, temperatures will be taken and masks will be worn.</li> </ul>
